The revision of the EU's Emissions Trading System (ETS) is now well underway as the EU institutions dive deep into trialogue negotiations.

The international transport sectors oftentimes go under the radar as more contentious topics take center stage, but they are, nevertheless, very much a central part of the EU ETS' role in tackling the climate crisis. However, there is still a long way to go to align both sectors' path towards climate neutrality.

This fourth ETS Talks aims to highlight the importance of the EU ETS in addressing the negative environmental impacts associated with air travel and maritime transport.
