THE LIFE CAP PT II PROJECT OBTAINS A POSITIVE SCORE in the 1st MONITORING VISIT – dissemination of the Project confirmed in

The LIFE CAP PT II Project, coordinated by APA, IP, in partnership with DGEG, SRAAC, IFCN and DDL, obtains a positive note in the 1st monitoring visit carried out by ELMEN EEIG in November 9th. After analysis and making of the first status of the Project, the opinion resulting from the monitoring reflects the commitment of the project team to comply with the Grant Agreement, aiming national capacity building for the LIFE Programme.

Examples of this success were the sectoral information sessions and workshops held in various regions of the country, and the 1st meeting of the Stakeholder Board, all of which events planned to continue the dissemination of the LIFE Programme.

During the month of September, more sessions and workshops were held, this time on the theme of Clean Energy Transition (CET), in Évora (5th), Porto (27th) and Coimbra (28th), which culminated in a total of 80 participants. Very interesting and positive, these events resulted as great added value from the interaction between the various stakeholders, since the knowledge of the participants about this sub-programme of the LIFE Programme was still superficial at this stage.

A meeting of the Stakeholder Board was also held on September 29th with the participation of more than 30 entities (companies, NGOs and associations from various sectors of activity). These entities are groups or organizations that are potential beneficiaries of LIFE funding, and can help in the dissemination of this EU Funding Program, being a key piece for the success of LIFE CAP PT II.
